

Camp Fowler is a non-profit summer children's camp, owned and operated by the Reformed Church in America, through the Regional Synod of Albany. In the off season they offer on-site retreats and private rentals. All income goes toward ensuring that any child who wants to, can come to camp. They offer overnight camp sessions for campers coming out of 3rd through 12th grade. Campers who choose a Residential Camp week will stay in cabins on a 245 acre campus on the shores of Sacandaga Lake. 
Fellowship
